AMP NAMES SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT OF RISK CONTROL

(Columbus) American Municipal Power, Inc. (AMP) recently expanded its executive management team, naming Bobby Little as Senior Vice President of Risk Control. Little started with the Columbus-based organization on July 15, and brings with him more than 25 years of related industry experience to the new position.

Little is the former executive director of risk management for Southern California Edison. In addition, he worked as an audit/compliance manager for Tulsa, Oklahoma-based Williams Power and held various management positions for Progress Energy. He has extensive experience in developing and managing organizational risk management plans and policies, audit plans, risk mitigation strategies and compliance issues.

"AMP is a diverse and evolving organization and risk management is a critical function," AMP President/CEO Marc Gerken said. "AMP is a partner with our 129 member utilities and

power supply remains our principal mission. Working with our members on power supply strategies involves: generation development and management; fuel procurement; negotiating power supply contracts; analyzing the impact of a variety of regulations; and general contract management. Bobby brings a wealth of related experience to this position and will contribute greatly to efforts to enhance and expand our existing risk management activities."

In his position at AMP, Little will chair the Risk Management Committee and provide overall management of the Middle Office – the independent oversight, compliance, control and monitoring office for the organization. This includes the day-to-day valuation, reporting and monitoring of all power, energy and fuel procurement activities, as well as developing, implementing and overseeing an Enterprise Risk Management Program. His responsibilities also include management of AMP's Corporate Energy Risk Control Policy.

Little holds a BS in Business Administration from the University of North Carolina and an MBA in Finance from Campbell University.

American Municipal Power, Inc. is the nonprofit wholesale power supplier and services provider for 129 member municipal electric systems in the states of Ohio, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Virginia, Kentucky, West Virginia and Delaware. Combined, these public utilities serve more than 625,000 customers. AMP members receive their power supply from a diversified resource mix that includes wholesale power purchases through AMP and the open market and energy produced at AMP and member-owned generating facilities utilizing fossil fuel, hydroelectric, wind and other renewable resources. In 2012, AMP sold approximately 12.7 million MWh of energy, with approximately \$775 million in power sales revenue and total assets of more than \$5.5 billion. The organization is focused on sustainability and increased use of renewable generation resources. AMP currently has four run-of-the-river hydroelectric projects under construction on the Ohio River. Combined these four projects will add more than 300 MW of new hydro capacity to the region. AMP is pursuing additional hydro, solar, wind and landfill gas projects.
